Let us read and reason together - 2



Suppose you want to remember a verse or a passage or its location for future use or to tell somebody in need when you read the Bible. What will you do? We will take note of the book name, chapter, and verse numbers. Isn't it?

The Bible's chapter and verse divisions help us quickly find the passage we want and tell others to read it. For those who need to know God's unconditional love, we would ask them to read John 3:16; to tell about God's faithfulness in our lives, we refer to Lamentations 3:22-23; to encourage others we love to quote 1 Thes.5:16-19; Numbers 23:23 and Psalm 121:7-8 are to tell God's protection for his people; for those who need healing, we refer to Exodus 15:26, Psalm 103:2-5, Psalm 147:3, 1 Peter 2:24, and Matthew 10:8.

Likewise, we can list many verses for all seasons of our lives. God still speaks to us through the Bible. Chapter and Verse numbers in the Bible help us in many ways. This privilege was unavailable to Christians for more than the first ten centuries. You may be surprised that the original biblical manuscripts, written in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek, did not have divisions for chapters or verses.

Jewish Scholars began to divide the Old Testament into verses from the 9th century. In the early 1200s, Stephen Langton, the Archbishop of Canterbury, developed the chapter system and split the Old and New Testaments into chapters, creating a more manageable structure for readers.

However, the first full Bible to be published with verse and chapter divisions was Robert Estienne's edition of the Latin Vulgate in 1555. The first English Bible to feature both chapter and verse divisions as we know them today was the Geneva Bible, published in 1560. Including chapter and verse divisions in the Bible helped make the text more accessible and easier to study.

Next time, when you tell or read your favourite verse of the Bible, read the text in context (consider the surrounding verses) to understand the meaning of a verse or a passage. A systematic and regular Bible reading helps us understand what God wants to speak to us today. Our GODependence Bible reading challenges enable you to start reading the whole Bible within the period of your choice.

However, when the Holy Bible, which contains everything we need for our lives, is available to us we cannot excuse ourselves by saying, "I don't know." It is essential to read and understand it.

We congratulate and thank everyone who enthusiastically participated in the 'Bible Crossword Puzzle' and 'Let's Play Bible Game' from last month's Newsletter. We invite you to continue engaging in such activities in every newsletter and deepen your knowledge of the Scriptures.

A call to remember God's faithfulness

Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. (Lamentations 3:22-23)

When a new year or month begins, many people are enthusiastic, expectant, and joyful about it. Many Christians would like a new blessed beginning with a promise verse that encourages, comforts, and offers hope to them. However, we usually are not excited to talk about our past. We recall our failures, losses, insults, weaknesses, hardships, and sufferings. That will make it hard for us even to think about the past. Based on their experience, some say, "Past is bleak, future is dim." They presume that their future will be uncertain and without hope. We have completed eleven months of 2024. What do you think about it? You may have a flash of memories that remind you of all that occurred this year.

In Lamentations, Living in Exile, God's people lamented their plights, misery, and all their sufferings meted out to them by their enemies. The Book of Lamentations paints a painful image of people's difficulties that tells us of their enemy's brutal killings of their kings, princes, priests, prophets, elders, and innocent people. Moreover, their living condition was pathetic (Lamentations 2:20; 4:10). They lost all their splendors. While they hopelessly lament their sorrows and affliction, suddenly, they remember something that gives them a ray of hope (Lamentations 3:21).

Despite all their painful experiences, they realized they were alive only because of the Lord's great love. They sang, "We, the God's people, are not consumed because of the Lord's great love."

They knew that they were not worthy of receiving God's grace. However, they understood that His love is unfailing and unending. That made them say, "We are not consumed, for His compassions never fail." God's love and compassion are inseparable. Whether the sun rises in the mornings, God's great love and compassion are new every morning.

Let us take time to remember how God was with us even when we did not recognize his presence. We may have thought that we suffered alone with no one to help. But, God in His great love was/is with us when we passed through the rivers and walked through the fire (Isaiah 43:1-5). God protects us like the apple of his eye. We often do not realize what would have happened if the Lord had not been with us (Ps. 124). When we contemplate God's faithfulness, we will understand how faithful he was/is to his promises even when we are not faithful to him (2 Timothy 2:13).

Dear friends, I invite you to "Count your blessings" and praise God for His faithfulness in fulfilling his promises. He does everything in His perfect timing. We can trust him always. When we trust God and his promises, we will sing like the psalmist: "How could I be silent when it's time to praise you? 5 YEARS OF GODependence



We have been learning about the 'Journey of GODependence Over the Past Five Years' through a Q&A series titled '5 Years of GODependence.' In the previous newsletter, Dr. Pethuru Devadason, the one who initiated this ministry, discussed topics such as whether this ministry began as an online initiative during the COVID-19 lockdown, how the ministry evolved, how the challenge to read the entire Bible in a month was initiated and implemented, and how the current 6 time-based plans for Bible reading challenge originated. This month, we continue with more questions for him. Let's dive in!

Question: Brother, in the last newsletter, you shared an excellent account of the beginnings of the GODependence ministry. How did you choose the name 'GODependence'?

Answer: The word GODependence does not exist in the English dictionary; it is a term we coined ourselves. My writing journey was deeply nurtured and influenced during college, thanks to the Tharisana Sudar magazine published by the Union of Evangelical Students of India – Tamilnadu. At the time, my primary focus was to write articles to meet the magazine's needs. After my postgraduate studies, in 2007, I started writing independently for the Christian community and began publishing my articles on a blog. I named this blog GODependence, combining the words GOD and Dependence.

I vividly recall a quote I once read in the Our Daily Bread devotional book during my college days: "True freedom is found in dependence on God." Inspired by this, I aimed to use my writings to guide people toward a life of dependence on God. So the blog description given is: "This is the place where people who want to go dependent on God (GODependence) can find resources to do so." Later, as the Bible Reading Challenges began in 2019, I used the same name for these initiatives. Even as friends joined me voluntarily in this endeavour, there was never a debate about the name. In July 2022, when we officially registered the ministry, it was formally named GODependence Trust.

Question: What is the vision and mission of the GODependence ministry?

Answer: We firmly believe that "True freedom is found in dependence on God." With this belief in mind, our vision is "to provide people with the vision, inspiration, and strength to structure their lives in dependence on God." Bible reading and prayer are like the two eyes of a believer. Therefore, our mission is to help people grow in their dependence on God by actively engaging in Scripture and prayer.

Question: What is the vision and mission of the GODependence ministry?

Answer: In the previous issue, we saw how the Bible Reading Challenge initiatives eventually evolved into the GODependence ministry. Those who successfully completed reading the Bible once or for the first time within a set timeframe were so inspired that they began reading it repeatedly with great enthusiasm. This is why the Bible Reading Challenges continue successfully to this day. Michael S. Heiser, a Bible scholar, rightly says that our relationship with the Holy Scriptures doesn't end with just reading the Bible but begins with it. Therefore, our vision is for those who regularly and systematically read the Bible to progress to the next levels, such as Bible Meditation, Bible Memorization, and Bible Study, enabling them to deepen their engagement with the Word of God.

As such, alongside the regular Bible Reading Challenges (BRC), Bible Meditation Groups (BMG) were initiated in August 2020 to facilitate systematic meditation on the Holy Scriptures. These groups continued for a year but were paused for a period. They resumed again in July 2022 and ran for another year. We plan to restart them in January 2025 and conduct them consistently.

The initiatives for memorising Bible verses are still in the preparatory stage within our teams. We are making efforts to implement them in children's Bible Reading groups. Once these initiatives are established, we intend to extend them to the Bible reading challenges for adults. Regarding arrangements for Bible study, while we have a clear plan and operational framework, our approach is to guide people step-by-step through Bible reading, meditation, and memorisation, leading eventually to Bible study activities.

Publishing high-quality spiritual books based on needs is one of our initiatives. So far, we have published five books, and preparation work for releasing six more books is currently underway. Additionally, God has granted us the opportunity to commemorate the First International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) on December 16, 2023. We remain ready and willing to venture in such God-led initiatives.

Question: What measures have you implemented to help participants successfully complete the GODependence Bible Reading Challenges?

Answer: Completing the whole Holy Bible through the Bible Reading Challenge is no easy task, which is why it is called a "challenge." Success requires commitment, consistent effort, and disciplined reading. To assist the participants, we undertake the following: Every midnight, we send the day's designated Bible reading portions to the group, accompanied by a "quote image." These images emphasise the greatness, significance, and importance of reading the Bible but do not include any personal promises, warnings, or advice. This ensures participants are motivated daily to read the portions assigned.

Every Sunday, we open the group to allow participants to share their reading progress. This not only encourages the individuals to share their status but also motivates others in the group. Those who are lagging or facing challenges can share their struggles and receive suggestions and encouragement from the group itself, enabling them to move forward in their Bible reading journey. Additionally, every two weeks, we conduct a review via Google Forms. This allows participants to record their reading status weekly in the group and bi-weekly through the form.

For those who record "50% or less" progress, we reach out to them personally. We discuss options to help them continue with the same challenge or join another challenge to complete their Bible reading. Hence, there's practically no chance for a participant who logs their progress to remain stagnant in their reading journey. However, the reality is that only those who are reading consistently or genuinely attempting to read tend to record their progress. If everyone actively utilises this feature, it could significantly help most participants complete their Bible reading successfully and enthusiastically.

Question: How do you ensure a participant has successfully completed the Bible Reading Challenge, i.e., fully read the Holy Bible?

Answer: At the end of the Bible Reading Challenge, we send a Final Review link to the group on the last day of the month. Through this link, participants detail their final reading status and experiences. Those who report 90% or more completion are considered to have successfully completed the challenge. Such participants are rewarded with digital or printed certificates of appreciation, along with gifts (for those completing one- or two-month challenges). Generally, participants who report successful completion during the Final Review have consistently updated their progress weekly in the group or bi-weekly through the review forms. However, some participants may not share progress throughout but only report successful completion in the Final Review. When someone reports finishing the entire Holy Bible during the review, we account for their Christian integrity and recognize them as having completed the challenge. However, there is no doubt that weekly or biweekly updates in the group or through the provided links not only encourage others to participate in the group but also motivate us to organise these activities effectively.



2 More Weeks to go... International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) – 16 December 2024

The first ever "International Day of Bible Reading" was initiated and organised on the 16th of December 2023 by the GODependence Team remembering Mary Jones, a little girl whom God used to bring awareness of making the Bible available for all to read and know God's Word. This momentous occasion calls upon us to embrace the wisdom, guidance, and inspiration encapsulated within the pages of the Holy Bible by making it a habit of reading it.

Hundreds of GODependence Bible Reading Challenge participants joined in the inauguration ceremony held in Zoom on 16 December. More than 5000 people from various parts of the world became aware of the observance of the International Day of Bible Reading through various initiatives taken. This time we are aiming to make it more international than before.

The following are the suggested activities for the International Day of Bible Reading on 16 December 2024. You can plan to implement as much as possible on the 16 December or keep some of them for the 15 December which falls on Sunday.

Individually how shall I participate in the International Day of Bible Reading?

- Spend some time reading the scriptures, meditating, taking notes from it for your personal life, and spending time devoting yourself to it on December 16.
- One can meditate on a particular verse or portion of the Bible.
- Take a photo or selfie while you read and meditate on the Bible and share it on your WhatsApp Status, Facebook, Instagram, etc.
- You can also share the captured video of the recitation of memorised verses on your social networking sites.
- You can present the Holy Bible to someone in need in the circle of friends.
- While sharing the above photos, pictures, or videos on social media sites, use (#) hashtags #InternationalDayofBibleReading and #IDBR2024. It will ensure the "International Day of Bible Reading" reaches more people.
- It will also let all the people in your circle of friends know the details of the International Day of Bible Reading.

What could we do as a family, a church, or a group to observe International Day of Bible Reading On December 16?

- Come together as a group to a place and take turns to read a specific passage or Book of the Bible.
- Organize events or competitions to recite memorised verses.



The story of Shiphrah and Puah in Exodus 1:15-21 is a remarkable example of faith, courage, and obedience to God in the face of severe risk.

Pharaoh feared the growing strength of the Hebrew people, and in his desire to control them, he ordered Shiphrah and Puah to kill all newborn Hebrew boys. But they refused Pharaoh's horrific command. This act of defiance saved the lives of many Hebrew boys.

Lessons from Shiphrah and Puah's Faith


Obey God Courageously: Shiphrah and Puah teach
us that obeying God sometimes requires us to stand
against unjust systems, even at great personal risk.
Their story encourages us to put God's commands
above human authority when the two conflict,
trusting that God's purposes are worth any risk
involved.

- Trust God's Sovereignty: The midwives had no guarantee of safety, yet they trusted that God would protect them. Their trust was rewarded, as God protected them and blessed them by giving them families of their own.
- Recognise the Power of Small Acts: Shiphrah and Puah were "ordinary" women who made an extraordinary impact. They show us that even small acts of faithfulness and courage can play a greater part in God's larger story of redemption.
- Believe in God's Blessing: When we obey God, His blessings may come in unexpected ways.

Shiphrah and Puah remind us that faith often requires risk, but God honours those who obey Him.

 The second part of the book emphasizes Jesus Christ as the suffering Servant who came to save all people. Mark explains the core teaching of the early church that Jesus suffered, died, and was resurrectedthrough the events of Jesus' life. This Gospel is unique because it focuses more on Jesus' actions than His teachings. Unlike Matthew, it doesn't begin with a genealogy, as Gentiles would not be interested in His ancestral lineage. Instead, it focuses on Jesus' ministry to Gentiles and His message of salvation for all. After introducing Jesus, Mark describes Jesus' public ministry, which began in Galilee and spread to Judea. Jesus touched many lives, and His crucifixion, death, burial, and resurrection were pivotal events witnessed by His faithful followers, particularly women.




BIBLE MEDITATION GROUPS (BMG) - JANUARY 2025
