Let us read and reason together – 4

The sweetness of God's word in the Bible is often compared to honey. The Psalmist says, "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Psalm 19:10; 119:103). As we all know, honey is both sweet and nourishing. Honey has been used as a medicine for centuries across the world. When we think about the sweetness of honey, we may have mouth-watering moments. However, Have you ever thought about honeybees?

A single honeybee will only produce approximately 1/12 teaspoon of honey in her lifetime. It means that one teaspoon (5 ml) of honey is the lifetime work of 12 honeybees. A honeybee visits 50-100 flowers in one trip. Honeybees never sleep. The honeybee is the only insect that produces food for humans. You can find many such interesting details about honey and honey bees. As I mentioned earlier, the Bible in our hands does not come easily to our hands. It has a great history of God's salvation story written by authors who had mostly never met the other authors who lived in different times for 1500 years.



One of the common reasons or excuses people often say about their lack of intimacy with God's word is that they do not have time to read the Bible as they have a busy schedule almost every day. When you find a 5 minutes time, you can read a book of the Bible within that available time. If you have 10 mins, you can finish reading Apostle Peter's second letter. Likewise, depending on the availability of your time and convenience, you can read the books of the Bible based on the information given in page 9.

A Timeless Prayer

Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom. (Psalm 90:12)

One of the common and frequently heard phrases nowadays is, "*I am busy*." Every day, we see people restlessly and hurriedly running after various things in their lives. When they say "*I am busy*," it means that "*do not disturb me*," "*I have no time for you*," "*I have so much to do*," "*I do not have time even to breathe or think about me*," and so on. We might think that they all use their time effectively without wasting a single minute on unnecessary matters. However, statistics present a different picture.

On average, people spend about 2 hours 30 mins to 3 hours daily on social media. People are addicted to social media platforms like Facebook, YouTube, Instagram, and WhatsApp without realizing the control and influence they can have in one's life. They, people in all age groups, can access many things at their fingertips. Sometimes, the latest technological advancements and their availability to everyone make us think whether they are good or bad.

On the other hand, the Bible teaches us to value our time and make the most of our time. We must admit that we all have the same amount of time, whether rich or poor, young or old, educated or illiterate. Some people think and act as if they would live for thousands of years on this earth. They spend their energy and time acquiring wealth and possessions without knowing or caring about their end. Jesus told about one such person in a parable. The rich man thought that he could spend his remaining life in wealth and worldly pleasures.



The Hezekiah's Tunnel is described in the Bible

This is a recent photo of Hezekiah's Tunnel in Jerusalem, measuring approximately 533 meters in length and constructed around 701 BCE.

To safeguard Jerusalem's water supply from being cut off by the invading Assyrian forces, King Hezekiah built this tunnel to redirect water from the Gihon Spring–Jerusalem's primary water source—to a safer location inside the city walls, the Pool of Siloam.



Ebed-Melech

The man who became instrumental in saving many inhabitants of Jerusalem

(JEREMIAH 38:1-13; 39:15-18)

During Nebuchadnezzar's siege of Jerusalem, the prophet Jeremiah told King Zedekiah, "Whoever stays in this city will die by the sword, famine, or plague, but whoever goes over to the Babylonians will live." This infuriated the king's officials. They put Jeremiah into a cistern and left him to die. When Ebed-Melech, a Cushite and royal palace official, heard about it he approached king Zedekiah in public at Benjamin Gate. He requested the king to save Jeremiah's life. As the king ordered, Ebed-Melech and others pulled Jeremiah out of the cistern. Because all the king's officials wanted to kill Jeremiah, Ebed-Melech had to risk his own life to save the prophet.


Jerusalem was captured by the Babylonians in 586 BCE. Jeremiah advised the people to surrender to the Babylonians instead of fighting them. Jeremiah's spiritual leadership helped the people survive the disaster. Because Jeremiah could continue his prophecy, Jerusalem could survive in exile.

God said Ebed-Melech, "I will save you...because you trust in me" (39:18).

Ebed-Melech's actions speak a lot to us:

- We must stand with those who are on the side of truth.
- When we find a need we must step in to help and, not be passive.
- To help others always involves risk but it's worth doing it.
- God will give us courage if we are ready to obey His will.
- God will use our actions of faith to save us and others.

Gospel of John

Time of Writing: A.D. 7-26 Time of Events: B.C. 80 - A.D. 90 Author of the Book: John Type of Book: Gospel

Introduction to the Book

John, the son of Zebedee, is the author of the fourth gospel, the oldest. The message that depicts Jesus as the God of the Old Testament is Christian tradition. This must be the beloved disciple whom the strongly seen in the seven "I am" statements of Jesus. He is the Gospel says wrote this (21:24). John's message about Jesus took a special form in his community, and then took a written form. Over time, it received some changes according to the needs of the Christian community and got its present form by adding a preface and appendix. John, the beloved disciple of Jesus, first became a disciple of John the Baptist and then became a disciple of Jesus (1:35-39). He was one of the three apostles who were very close to Jesus (Matthew 5:37; 9:2; 13:3, 14:33). He was leaning against Jesus' chest during the Last Supper (13:22-26) and stood at the foot of Jesus' cross even when all the other apostles had fled. Jesus entrusted his beloved mother to him (19:25-27).

Context and Purpose

The purpose of this book is "that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (20:31). The main purpose of the gospel was to deepen the Christian faith and strengthen the Christian life. Also, the purposes of John were to show that the old before Christ has passed away and the new has entered through Christ, to give a reliable testimony about Christ to the twelfth generation who did not see him directly (20:29) and to correct some wrong principles that appeared at the end of the first century (John the Baptist, the Messiah, etc.). This Gospel was written in Greek around AD 90 to fulfill these purposes. It was written in Ephesus.

Summary of the Book

John's Gospel includes only seven miracles-John calls them Practical Application "signs"—some of which are found only in John, such as the raising of • The Gospel of John fulfills its purpose of proclaiming the good news Lazarus to prove Christ's divinity and illustrate his ministry. John's is the most brilliant theology of the four gospels. John's Gospel shares much about the approaching ministry of the Holy Spirit after Jesus' ascension. Certain words or phrases form a recurring theme in John's Gospel: faith, witness, comfort, life-death, light-darkness, self and love. John's Gospel introduces Jesus Christ not from his birth, but from the "beginning" before creation. John calls Jesus "the Word" (Logos), who, as God, was involved in every aspect of creation (John 1:1-3) and then became flesh (verse 14). He is the spotless Lamb of God (verse 29). John's Gospel contains many spiritual dialogues, such as Jesus' conversation with the Samaritan woman, identifying him as the Messiah (John 4:26) and Jesus' meeting with Nicodemus explaining salvation through death on the cross (John 3:14-16). Jesus • The discourses of Jesus and other messages about Him are repeatedly angers the Jewish leaders by correcting them (John 2:13-16) through healing on the Sabbath, and attributing attributes that belong only to God (John 5:18; 8:56-59; 9:6, 16; 10:33). The last nine chapters of the Gospel of John refer to the final week of Jesus' life. Jesus prepares His disciples for His coming death and for their ministry after His resurrection and ascension (John 14-17). Then He willingly dies on the cross in our place (John 10:15-18), paying our sin debt in full (John 19:30) so that whoever believes in Him will be saved (John 3:14-16). Jesus rose from the dead and is God and Lord (John 20:24-29). At the very beginning, John tells us that Jesus is the Word who became man. By explaining his nature with metaphors such as light, life, way, truth, and food, he makes people of all times, places, religions, and cultures understand who Jesus is.

Jesus Christ in the Book

"bread of life" (John 6:35), just as God provided manna from heaven to feed the Israelites in the wilderness, He was provided by God to nourish the souls of His people (John 16:11-36). Jesus is the "light of the world" (John 8:12), the same light that God promised to His people in the Old Testament (Isaiah 30:26; 60:19-22), and in the New Testament, the culmination of this is seen in the New Jerusalem, where Christ, the Lamb, is seen as its light (Revelation 21:23). The two statements "I am" refer to Jesus as the "good shepherd" and "the gate for the sheep." There are clear references here to Jesus as the God of the Old Testament, the shepherd of Israel (Psalm 23:1; 80:1; Jeremiah 31:10; Ezekiel 34:23) and the only gate into the sheepfold. Jesus is the way of salvation. The Jews believed in the resurrection. In fact, they used this doctrine to deceive Him in order to bring forth accusations against Him. But, at Lazarus's tomb, He said, "I am the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25), which astonished them. He was stating that He is the cause of the resurrection and has authority over life and death. No one else could claim such a thing but God. Similarly, Jesus' statement "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6) unmistakably connects Him to the Old Testament. The "way of holiness" prophesied in Isaiah 35:8 belongs to Him; while in Jerusalem, He established the city of truth from Zechariah 8:3; He preached the truths of the gospel. By saying "life," Jesus affirms His divinity as the Creator of life (John 1:1-3; Genesis 2:7). Finally, as the "true vine" (John 15:1, 5), He identifies Himself with Israel, which is often referred to as the Lord's vineyard in many Old Testament passages. As the true vine of Israel, He portrays Himself as the Lord of "true Israel" - those who come to Him in faith are said to be in Him as branches.

to those who have lost their way (John 3:16). From the recorded conversations between Jesus and Nicodemus and the woman at the well (chapters 3-4), we learn a great deal about the model of Jesus' personal gospel. His words of comfort to His disciples before His death (John 14:1-6, 16; 16:33) provide great solace during times of sorrow. Jesus' "high priestly prayer" for believers in chapter 17 serves as a wonderful source of encouragement for the faithful. John's teachings about the divinity of Christ, who was fully God and fully man (John 1:1-3, 14; 5:22-23; 8:58; 14:8-9; 20:28), help to clearly reveal who Jesus is.

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
