A Reason to Pray & Praise

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. (James 5: 13)

Some people say about something that did not happen by saying, "If I had done this, I would have avoided or received this." Some people live in their past; they either live in their past glory or regret their past failures. We must remember that what is past is past; we cannot change it. We must live in the present and prepare ourselves for the future.

In James 5, we see some practical suggestions for living in our present. James asks some simple questions and tells us what should be done in such situations. When a person is in trouble, his immediate response should be prayer. In Jam.5:13, James does not mention what kind of trouble it is. The Jewish Christians of that time were facing persecution, discrimination, and humiliation for their Christian faith. We may face various troubles in our lives. At such times, when we pray, we express our reliance on God and seek his help and power to overcome our troubles.

As we pray, we can be confident in God that "there is no need that prayer cannot meet and no problem that prayer cannot solve." When we read the context of James 5:13, we see that prayer is the key theme in James 5:13-18. Every verse of this passage says something about prayer.

Eusebius, a third-century Christian leader, writes that James was a man of prayer who believed in the power of prayer. He was known for spending more time on his knees and praying for the people. His knees became calloused like a camel's, so people called him "The man with Camel's Knees." James tells us what he practised in his life. When a person is happy, James calls to "sing songs of praise." Whether we suffer or prosper, we can go to God in prayer and praise. We should not forget our God who blesses us. As Steven J. Cole says, "all of life, whether suffering or sufficiency, should be lived with a God-ward, God-dependent focus."

In chapter 1, James writes, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds" (Jam.1:2). Pastor David Guzik says, "James has the same advice for both the suffering one and the cheerful one: take it all to the Lord. In fact, the two commands could be reversed: sufferers should sing also, and the cheerful should also pray." Regardless of our present situation, we can pray and praise God for everything.





Naaman was the commander of the army of Aram. He was a valiant soldier, highly regarded by his master, but he had leprosy.



Introduction to the Bible - Acts of the Apostles

Acts

Time of Writing: A.D. 62 Time of Events: A.D. 30 - A.D. 62

Introduction to the Book

The book called "The Acts of the Apostles" is the second part of the Gospel of Luke (1:1). In the latter part of this book, the author writes that he is presenting a compilation of the events he himself witnessed.
 Passages such as "we travelled," "we stayed," and "we preached" sacrificial 3:23-29).
 17; 20:1-18; 27:1-28:16).

Context and Purpose

• This book provides the history of the early church. It also shows how the apostles were witnesses of Christ in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the surrounding world, as well as the gift of the Holy Spirit and the many miracles that took place to confirm the apostles' message. This book covers the transitional period between Christ's ascension and the fulfillment of the New Testament covenant. The author writes this book to emphasize that neither Christ nor His followers committed any crime against the Roman Empire, and that Paul, who was chosen as an apostle to the Gentiles, did no great wrong against the Jews. It is clear in this book that it is the church's duty to testify to God's plan of salvation with the help of the Holy Spirit. The ministry of the apostles—especially Peter and Paul—is highlighted. The book concludes with Paul testifying in Rome.

Key Verses

Acts1:8, 2:4, 4:12, 4:19-20, 9:3-6, 16:31

Summary of the Book

The statement of the risen Lord in Acts 1:8 serves as the central message of this book. Jews, Samaritans, Greeks, and people of other nations are filled with the Holy Spirit and become witnesses of the Lord. As the ministry of the Word grows and expands, churches are established everywhere. Therefore, this book can also be called "The Acts of the Holy Spirit." The sermons of Peter, Stephen, and Paul, as well as the conversion experiences of Peter and Paul, are found in this book. When describing Christians, the book highlights unity, fellowship, prayer, witnessing, service, and sharing love (11:27-30; 2:42-47; 4:32-37) as distinctive qualities of the disciples. The conversion of Paul on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-31) is a special feature of this book. The disciples, empowered by the Holy Spirit, became His witnesses in Jerusalem (Acts 1-8:3), in Judea and Samaria (8:4-12:25), and to the ends of the earth (13:1-28). The latter part of the book includes Paul's three missionary journeys (13:1-21:16), his trials in Jerusalem and Caesarea (21:17-26:32), and his journey to Rome (27:1-28:31). This book emphasizes the work of the Holy Spirit in guiding the early church and spreading the Gospel to all nations, showcasing the transformative power of faith and the unity of believers in Christ.

Jesus Christ in the Book

• The Book of Acts confirms the transition from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant. In the Old Testament, the primary activity was the external "anointing" of God's people. Among them were Moses (Numbers 11:17), Othniel (Judges 3:8-10), Gideon (Judges 6:34), and Saul (1 Samuel 10:6-10). After Jesus' ascension, the Holy Spirit came to dwell in the hearts of believers (Romans 8:9-11; 1 Corinthians 3:16), guiding and strengthening them from within. The Holy Spirit is God's gift to those who come to Him in faith. Paul, who was "blameless concerning the righteousness based on the law" (Philippians 3:6), realized that all his legal efforts were futile and considered them "rubbish." He said, "I do not have a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith" (Philippians 3:8-9). In Acts 10:9-15, Peter's vision of the sheet filled

with unclean animals is another sign of the transition from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant, where Jews and Gentiles unite in a universal church. In Peter's vision, the "unclean" animals symbolized the Gentiles, who were declared "clean" by God through Christ's sacrificial death. The Old Covenant law fulfilled its purpose (Galatians 3:23-29).

Practical Application

• The Book of Acts shows how God, through His Spirit, strengthens ordinary people and enables them to do extraordinary things. It demonstrates how God took a group of fishermen and commoners and used them to turn the world upside down (Acts 17:6). God transformed Paul, who once persecuted Christians, into the greatest Christian evangelist in history, and he went on to write nearly half of the New Testament books. God used the persecution experienced by Christians to spur the incredible and rapid expansion of the growing church. In the same way, God can transform our hearts, strengthen us through the Holy Spirit, and give us a fervor to spread the gospel of salvation through Christ. If we try to accomplish God's work in the world by our own strength, we will fail. Like the disciples in Acts 2, we must faithfully proclaim the gospel, trust God for the results, and devote ourselves to "the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer" (Acts 2:42).
