Father, forgive...

Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do." (Luke 23:34)

Recently as I was thinking about the relationship issues among my Christian friends, I realised that their hurt and broken hearts created a gulf between them. Why do such good and godly Christians have such struggles, why could they not love and honor one another instead of experiencing bitter feelings in their hearts? I had many such questions like these swirled in my thoughts. God helped me to see the bitter reality of the underlying issue. They could not forgive and forget the things their friends or loved ones committed against them knowingly or unknowingly.

People often say, "To err is human, to forgive is divine." However, many of us struggle to forgive others, even our closest relatives and friends. Some say, "I will forgive but will never/cannot forget what s/he did against me." In a way, this is also unforgiveness. I am surprised to know that UNFORGIVENESS can cause many diseases and evil in our modern mobile world.

If we count the number of times we asked the Lord to forgive us....I doubt whether we can finish counting them. We all know that it will be countless. We do not hesitate to ask God to forgive us, but we are reluctant to ask others to forgive us even for our mistakes and misdeeds. Our EGO and self-respect hinder us from doing it. Some pray, "Lord, I cannot ask sorry with the person, so please forgive me even for not asking the person to forgive me (or reconciling with him/her)." Let us remember: we should not hesitate to say sorry and seek forgiveness, whoever we may be.

Many times, it is not difficult to ask for forgiveness when we know that the mistake is on our part. If we did not do anything wrong, or when we are suffering without any reason, what should we do? We should set our eyes on Jesus. We should follow what Jesus did. We should forgive others with all our hearts and pray for them. Instead of accusing or blaming others, we need to intercede for them in prayer. When we do this, we will receive the reward of righteousness from our God.

Jesus is "holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and has become higher than the heavens." However, he was mocked, abused, condemned, and was crucified on the cross. Leders could not prove their accusations against Jesus. Everyone knew that Jesus was a just person. Even Pilate confessed "I am innocent of the blood of this just Person." However, he delivered Jesus to the evil religious leaders.

BUT JESUS forgave all of them. In his prayer, he said, "they do not know what they do." Let us remember Jesus, "who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls."

When we are not able to forgive someone as we have deep hurts and are irritated about the person, it affects our spiritual life. It makes our prayers and meditations shallow and empty, making it difficult to experience God in our lives. Therefore, realizing the greatness of forgiveness, let us ask God, "Lord, forgive me. Help me to forgive others and go to others to seek forgiveness without any reservations and reluctance." May God help us to practice this just as Jesus did.

Spiritual and Physical Benefits of Fasting and Prayer

"More than any other discipline, fasting reveals the things that control us. This is a wonderful benefit to the

The practices of fasting and prayer, often intertwined throughout history, hold profound significance for both the spiritual and physical well-being of individuals. This powerful synergy is not merely a temporary discipline but a transformative lifestyle choice, offering a unique pathway to deeper communion with God and tangible benefits for the physical body. By intentionally abstaining from food or drink and dedicating oneself to focused prayer, believers can experience a heightened spiritual sensitivity and unlock potential physical advantages.

Biblical Foundation for Fasting and Prayer

The teachings of Jesus implicitly link fasting with prayer and giving as fundamental duties of every Christian. When Jesus spoke of these practices, He used the phrases "When you give...", "When you pray..." and "When you fast," indicating that fasting, like the other two, was a normal part of the Christian life. Furthermore, the Old Testament reveals that God absolutely required fasting of all His people under the old covenant, with severe consequences for those who neglected it on the Day of Atonement. Throughout the Bible, numerous examples illustrate the significance of combining fasting and prayer in seeking God's favor, guidance, and deliverance.

Spiritual Benefits

The combined discipline of fasting and prayer yields a wealth of spiritual benefits, fostering a closer relationship with God and enhancing spiritual discernment. When you eliminate food from your diet for a number of days, your spirit becomes uncluttered by the things of this world and amazingly sensitive to the things of God. This heightened sensitivity can lead to deeper intimacy with the Lord and knowledge of God's perfect will. Richard Foster, in **Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth**, notes that "More than any other discipline, fasting reveals the things that control us. This is a wonderful benefit to the true disciple who longs to be transformed into the image of Jesus Christ. We cover up what is inside of us with food and other things." Thus, fasting and prayer become a powerful tool for self-reflection and spiritual growth.

Furthermore, fasting and prayer are presented as a secret key that unlocks heaven's door and slams shut the gates of hell, signifying their potent spiritual impact. They serve as a means of humbling ourselves before God, as King David declared, "I humbled myself with fasting" (Psalm 35:13). This posture of humility is crucial for drawing near to God and receiving His grace. During periods when one feels distant from God, fasting can trigger rejuvenation and revitalization of the spiritual connection.

The practice also focuses our attention on God & express our dependence upon Him. It is a powerful way to seek God by humility and to align our hearts with the will of God. Moreover, fasting prepares the way for God to give you fresh revelation, fresh vision, and clear purpose. It keeps one sensitive to His Spirit, enabling you to live holy. The yearning expressed in Psalm 42:1-2, "As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God?", often resonates deeply during times of fasting and prayer.

Physical Considerations

While the primary emphasis of combining fasting and prayer is often spiritual, the sources also touch upon physical aspects. Believers are called to "Present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service" (Rom. 12:1). Engaging in disciplined fasting can be seen as an act of presenting the body in a way that is conducive to spiritual focus.

Furthermore, fasting, when aligned with spiritual seeking, can have tangible physical benefits:

- Fasting brings physical health naturally and supernaturally (Isaiah 58:8).
- Fasting prepares us for temptation (Matthew 4:1-11). This may relate to developing self-control and a reliance on spiritual strength rather than physical gratification.
- Fasting unlocks our calling (Acts 13:2). While the context here is primarily spiritual, it can imply a clarity of purpose that can influence one's physical actions and direction in life.
- Fasting releases divine power into your life (Luke 4:14, Deuteronomy 8:18). This empowerment may manifest both spiritually and physically, providing strength and resilience.

It is important to note the physiological stages one might experience during fasting, including initial hunger and cravings, and progressing through stages like ketosis and autophagy after extended periods. Awareness of potential side effects such as headaches, fatigue, and digestive issues is also crucial for a safe and effective fast. The guidance to consult your doctor before fasting if you have any medical issues underscores the importance of considering one's physical well-being.

Practical Guidance for Engaging in Fasting and Prayer

To effectively integrate fasting and prayer into one's spiritual life, the sources offer practical advice:

- Prepare yourself gradually before embarking on a fast.
- Start small when beginning, perhaps with shorter durations.
- Slowly cut back on food intake and increase water intake in the days leading up to the fast.
- Consult a doctor before fasting if you have any medical issues.
- Clear your schedule as much as possible to dedicate time to prayer and seeking God.
- Plan what you will consume if it is not a complete fast, focusing on simple sustenance like water or juice.
- Drink lots of water to stay hydrated.
- Set aside specific times to read your Bible and pray.
- Listen to praise music and worship God whenever possible.

- Make a list of what you are praying and believing God for.
- Avoid drawing attention to your fast; keep it a private matter between you and God.
- Unplug from distractions such as social media and excessive entertainment.
- When cravings hit, turn to prayer and ask God for strength.
- Be mindful of how you treat others, allowing the Spirit to guide your interactions.
- Always end your fast with prayer and praise, acknowledging God's faithfulness.
- Break your fast carefully, especially after longer periods. Begin with easily digestible foods like fruit or vegetable juices.
- Gradually return to regular eating with small snacks over a few days.
- Do not be discouraged by initial difficulties; building "fasting muscles" takes time.
- Avoid breaking your fast with a feast.

Fasting with the Right Heart

The sources also caution against improper motivations and approaches to fasting. Biblical fasting is not a hunger strike between you and God and is not intended to earn God's favor or manipulate Him. Christians should avoid hypocritical or showy fasting, fasting without repentance or change, fasting without compassion or justice, fasting as a ritual without heart, fasting for selfish motives, fasting without faith or trust in God, and fasting that harms the body. The focus should remain on seeking God with a sincere and humble heart. If it doesn't mean anything to you, it won't mean anything to God.

Conclusion

The combined practice of fasting and prayer offers a powerful pathway to holistic transformation. By intentionally engaging in physical abstinence and fervent spiritual seeking, individuals can cultivate a deeper intimacy with God, gain spiritual clarity, and even experience tangible physical benefits. When undertaken with the right motives and practical wisdom, this ancient discipline remains a vital tool for spiritual growth, development, and experiencing personal the transformative power of God in both the spiritual and physical realms. May the Lord help us to cultivate these spiritual disciplines in our lives.



Joseph of Arimathea The rich man who dared to bury Jesus

(MATT. 27:57-60; LK. 23: 50-53)


Joseph of Arimathea was a good and upright rich man. Though he was a prominent member of the Jewish Council, he had not consented to their decision and action to crucify Jesus because he was a disciple of Jesus Christ.

After the death of Jesus, he went boldly to Pilate and asked for Jesus' body. Joseph wrapped the body in a clean linen cloth and placed it in his new tomb.

During the trial, Pilate could not find any basis for a charge against Jesus. But the inscription of the cross portrayed that Jesus was crucified for sedition charges. From the human point of view, burying a person executed for sedition charges is a shameful act. But Joseph knew the truth about Jesus' death. So he disregarded the public opinion and did what was right. Joseph of Arimathea challenges us to show steadfast devotion to Jesus Christ.

- Even when believing in Jesus is risky, we should not turn back from faith.
- Joseph would have been aware of the opposition he would face from the Jews. But he was ready to pay the cost. Are we prepared to march forward in faith by paying the cost of discipleship?
- Joseph buried Jesus in a newly cut tomb in his place. Are we ready to honour Jesus by giving our best?

Summary of the Book

Paul was enthusiastic about finally being able to serve in the Roman church, and everyone was well aware of this fact (Romans 1:8-15). He planned to go to Rome and then to Spain (Romans 15:24), but his plans were disrupted when he was arrested in Jerusalem. He eventually went to Rome as a prisoner. Phoebe, a member of the church in Cenchreae near Corinth (Romans 16:1), likely delivered the letter to Rome. The Book of Romans can be divided into four sections:

- 1. The Need for Righteousness (1:18-3:20),
- Righteousness Provided (3:21-8:39),
- Righteousness Vindicated (9:1-11:36),
- Living Righteously (12:1–15:13).

Led by the Holy Spirit, Paul first condemns the sin of all humanity. He was assured that those in Rome would remain on the right path

 The He was not ashamed of the Gospel (Romans 1:16), because it is the power of God. The Book of Romans explains who God is, what He has done, what the death of Jesus Christ accomplished, and who we are-both without Christ and after believing in Him. In chapters 1-11, particularly in 1:17, it declares that "the righteous shall live by faith.* Whether Jews or Gentiles, all are enemies of God and need salvation. This salvation comes through faith in Jesus, not by the law or circumcision. Paul describes the new life as a spiritual life. In chapters 9-11, he explains that the Jews' rejection of Christ was part of God's plan so that all humanity might receive grace through Jesus. The Gentiles' repentance is meant to provoke the Jews to jealousy, and since God's promises to Israel are irrevocable, the Jews will one day turn to Christ.
