And even grace itself can lose the strength of heavenly favour and can be received and used as our due. "Gethsemane, can I forget?" Yes, I can; and in the forgetfulness, I lose the sacred awe of my redemption, and I miss the real glory of "Paradise regained." "Ye are not your own; ye are bought with a price." That is the remembrance that keeps the spirit lowly, and that fills the heart with love for Him "whose I am," and whom I ought to serve.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on behalf of the GODependence Team. I thank God for the opportunity to reconnect with you through this newsletter once again.

In a world filled with shifting values and endless distractions, one of the clearest marks of genuine Christian faith is consistency. To a 14-year-old schoolboy who asked, "How can I keep myself from falling and also help others?", the following challenge from the recently martyred Charlie Kirk makes us think even more deeply: "Read the Bible every single day, do what the Bible says, and tell others what it says." When these practices are embraced with a sincere heart, they not only deepen our walk with God but also shine as a powerful witness to the world.

1. Read the Bible Every Single Day:

The Bible is not just a religious book—it is God's living Word (Hebrews 4:12). Life is full of distractions, responsibilities, and noise that constantly compete for our attention. But just as our bodies cannot thrive without daily food, our souls cannot grow without God's Word. Jesus said, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." (Matthew 4:4). Even a few verses, read with an open heart, can give wisdom, encouragement, and correction for the day ahead (2 Timothy 3:16–17). Consistency matters more than quantity. Whether it is in the quiet of the morning or before resting at night, opening God's Word every single day is how we grow roots of faith that endure.

2. Do What the Bible Tells You to Do:

The Word of God is not meant to be read only—it is meant to be lived. James 1:22 warns us: "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." Jesus Himself said, "If you love Me, keep My commandments." (John 14:15). Obedience may sometimes be uncomfortable, countercultural, or even costly, but it is always rewarding. When we apply God's Word in our decisions, relationships, and daily actions, we become living testimonies of its truth. Real impact comes when our lives match what we read.

3. Tell People What the Bible Says:

The Good News is not meant to be kept to ourselves. Jesus' Great Commission calls us to share His Word with others (Matthew 28:19–20). Romans 10:17 reminds us, "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." When we speak God's Word with love and conviction, it plants seeds in hearts that the Holy Spirit can water and grow. Sharing the Bible doesn't always mean preaching a sermon—it could be as simple as speaking a verse of encouragement, explaining God's promises to a friend, or pointing someone to Jesus in conversation. When we boldly and lovingly declare what the Bible says, we partner with God in changing hearts and building His kingdom.

Each day that we choose to read, apply, and share God's Word, we grow stronger in faith and shine brighter in a world that desperately needs truth. Let us commit afresh this month to keep God's Word at the very center of our lives; because when the Bible is alive in us, Christ is revealed through us.

Our team met on 7 September 2025 to plan for the International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR2025) activities. This year we aim to extend the IDBR activities to all 10 languages in which GODependence Bible Reading Challenges are conducted, and to as many countries as possible. Please continue to keep the IDBR2025 plans in your prayers.

The report of the 3rd Family Get-together of our GODependence Team, held on 1st and 2nd August 2025 in Bangalore, along with the Results and highlights of the GODependence Newsletter Survey, has been included in the newsletter. Thank you all for actively taking part in the survey.

Continue to pray for this ministry and help introduce its services to others. May the name of the Lord be glorified.

Do I follow His footsteps?

Eventhough the call to live like Jesus is sprinkled all over the New Testament, there's only one place where we are specifically told to "followHis footsteps." It relates to suffering. The one who wrote it is Peter, a disciple who watched Jesus closely in Histrial and death. 1 Peter 2:21, "To this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should FOLLOW HIS STEPS." Here are a few questions to examine ourselves. Spenda few hours in quietness before God going through this questionnaire.

1. Do I get upset with my friends when they are indifferent towards my aches and sorrows?

When Jesus was sweating blood in the Garden of weakness instead of praying for him? Gethsemane, His closest disciples went off to sleep. Even after repeated requests they failed to share with Him in His soul agony. But He did not get angry with them. He simply exhorted them to be watchful in prayer and said, "Rise, let us be going!" (Mt 26:36-46).

2. Am I casual in prayer? Do I blame others or circumstances instead of my prayerlessnessfor my failures?

Jesus was subject to all sorts of temptation to sacrifice godly virtues while He was abused and illtreated. But He won the battle in Gethsemane itself in prayer. On the other hand the disciples failed miserably in every instance. A "willing spirit" is no guarantee to overcome a "weak flesh" unless there is watchfulness in prayer (Mk 14:35-39).

3. Do I insist that God should answer prayer in my own way? Am I afraid to say, "Not my will but Yours, O Lord?"

It was not easy for Jesus to wholeheartedly accept the cup knowing how bitter it was. True He prayed thrice that He might be spared, but each time His prayer concluded with the words, "Nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will" (Mt 26:39,42,44). The Father God was so pleased with this kind of surrender that He immediately sent a specialangel from Heavento strengthen His Son (Lk 22:42,43).

4. Do I publicize or criticize anyone's

Peter's weakness was stronger than his willingness. Jesus not only forewarned him but also prayed for him sincerely. He even encouraged him foretelling of his future ministry to his associates (Lk 22:31-34).

5. Do I hate someone because he has betrayed me? Do I forget that man is man and none but God is 100% trustworthy?

Jesus trusted Judas Iscariot with the money bag even though he had been a thief. Judas did not avail the opportunity Jesus gave him to change his heart. Neverthe-less, when Judas betrayed Jesus with a false kiss, Jesus addressed him as "Friend!" (Jn 12:4-6; Mt 26:50).

6. Do I use carnal weapons againstmy enemies? Don't I realize that no man can do anything against me beyond what God has permitted?

The healing of Malchus by Jesus was a rebuke on Peter's carnal act of cutting his ear. Refusing to use the sword eventhough we may have one is true spirituality (Jn 18:10,11; Mt 26:51,52). Jesus told Pilate, "You could have no power at all against Me unless it had been given you from Above!" (Jn 19:10,11).

7. Does my reaction to an offense convictthe offender or condemn him?

What Jesus predicted about Peter came to pass. Peter not only denied Him but also cursed Him. Imagine how hurting it would have been to Jesus! But His look at Peter was so full of understanding and compassion that it broke him to tears of remembrance and repentance (Lk 22:61,62).

8. When I am accused falsely, do I defend myself or leave it to God to fight my battles?

When the high priest asked Jesus, "What is it these men testify against You?", He kept silent (Mt 26:62,63). When Pilate asked Him the same question, Jesus answered him not one word! (Mt 27:13,14). Rather He witnessed to Pilate about the Kingdom of God and the Truth (Jn 18:36,37; 1 Tim 6:13).

9. Do I ask God to punish my enemies or pray that they may be blessed?

Jesus practised on Mount Golgotha what He had preached on the Mount in Galilee. (Mt 5:44; Lk 23:34).

10. Do I forget the needs and pains of others because of self-sympathy?

Jesus told the women who mournedhim, "Do not weep for Me, but weep for yourselves and your children" on whom difficult days were coming (Lk 23:27-29). In spite of His intense physical suffering, He ministered to the spiritual need of a robber who was crucified with Him (Lk 23:39-43). He also provided a care-taker son in His place for His mother (Jn 19:25-27).

11. Do I use prayer and spiritual gifts to impress people of my spirituality or glorify God?

If Jesus had prayed to His Father for angelic protection, battalions of angels would have been instantly despatched from Heaven for Him. How then could the Scriptures concerning His suffering befulfilled? (Mt 26:53,54). Also it would not have been impossible for Him to accept the challenge of the ridiculers to come down from the cross. How then would a perfect sacrifice for sins be made before the Father? (Mk 15:29-32).

12. When I come out successfully through a trial or crisis, do I make those who did not fully support me feel awkward and guilty?

In spite of the fact that Christ's disciples betrayed Him, denied Him, cursed Him, and forsook Him, He never once reminded them of their failures after His resurrection. Rather He promised them beforehand, "You are those who have continued with Me in My trials. I bestow upon you a Kingdom ... that you may eat and drink at My Table in My Kingdom, and sit on thrones" (Lk 22:28-30). He sent them all over the world and went with them (Mk 16:15,20).

International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) – 16 December

It was a privilege for the GODependence Team to organise the first-ever International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) on 16 December 2023, in remembrance of Mary Jones - a little girl whom God used to bring awareness of making the Bible available for all to read and know God's Word.

Hundreds of participants from GODependence Bible Reading Challenge groups joined the inauguration ceremony held on Zoom, and through various initiatives, more than 5,000 people from different parts of the world became aware of this observance.

On the 2nd International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR 2024), held on 16 December 2024, we were able to arrange Zoom meetings in three languages. We also conducted a Mega Online Bible Quiz in English and Tamil, along with 8-hour Online Bible Readathons in both languages separately.

The 3rd International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR 2025) will be observed on 16 December 2025. Beginning this year, we have decided to extend the observance into an International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) Week (10–16 December each year), to make it easier for activities to be held regardless of the day on which 16 December falls.

For IDBR 2025, we aim to extend activities to all 10 languages in which GODependence Bible Reading Challenges are conducted, and to as many countries as possible. More details on the action plan and suggested activities will be shared in next month's newsletter.



Onesiphorus

"A courageous disciple who refreshed Apostle Paul" (ഉത്താനുവാട്ടാ

Onesiphorus was a Christian from Ephesus mentioned by Paul in his second letter to Timothy. He is remembered for his faithfulness and kindness, especially for seeking out Paul in Rome when the apostle was imprisoned (2 Tim. 1:17). Unlike many others who abandoned Paul out of fear, Onesiphorus diligently searched until he found him. He refreshed and encouraged him, showing courage and loyalty. This was dangerous because supporting prisoners—especially Christians—could bring suspicion or punishment from authorities.

Most people would hesitate to associate with those in jail, unwilling to reveal friendship with convicts, but Onesiphorus did. That's why Paul prayed, "May the Lord show mercy to the household of Onesiphorus,

because he often refreshed me and was not ashamed of my chains" (2 Tim. 1:16). This suggests that Onesiphorus ministered to Paul both physically and spiritually during his imprisonment.

Points to Ponder

- Am I ready to stand with believers who are forsaken by others because of their faith in Christ?
- Am I willing to reach out and help them, even if it means taking risks?
- Am I ready to associate with believers who have a lesser social status than I have?
- Am I able to refresh and encourage those who are weary under life's burdens?

Your Name, Place, Family, Christian Background & Upbringing:

Glory be to the name of the Lord. My name is Lydial Sulochana. We came from a Hindu family, and in the year 2000, we accepted the Lord as our personal Savior. Both my daughter and I received water baptism and were filled with the Holy Spirit. Later, I gave my daughter in marriage into a Christian family, and their family is being blessed by the Lord. I also have two sons, and they and their families still need to accept the Lord.

How many times have you read the entire Bible so far? And how many times through GODependence Bible Reading?

By God's grace, I had read the Bible fully only once. After that, I used to start reading every year, but could never finish it. This went on year after year. Then in 2019, I received a WhatsApp message about GODependence, where they shared methods of reading the Bible. It made me very happy, so I joined the WhatsApp group and began reading.

For the first time, by God's grace, I was able to finish reading the whole Bible in just one month, which was a great surprise to me. After that, I was able to finish in 2 months, 3 months, 4 months, and 6 months. Through GODependence, I was able to complete reading the Bible two or three times a year. In 2024, I finished reading twice. After that, I also joined a one-year group.

In what ways did the GODependence group practices help you to finish reading?

The Bible meditations given in the one-year group were useful to share in the prayer meetings, house visits and Zoom meetings. The prayer points given for interceding for the nation were also very helpful. Participating in the weekly Bible quiz and answering questions was always exciting. I usually don't get time to watch the videos shared in the group. However, I've been introducing GODependence Bible Reading Challenges to others, encouraging them to join, and everyone has been benefitting.

What benefits have you received from reading the Holy Bible?

The main benefit I've received through these Bible Reading Challenges is the joy of always being connected to the Word of God. Since the reading plan covers portions from both the Old Testament and the New Testament, it feels like walking through a garden and gathering all kinds of vegetables to use. This has been very helpful in using many Bible verses effectively in ministry.

What challenges did you face while reading the Bible, and how did you overcome them?

Because of my physical weakness, house construction work, eye pain, travels, and ministry commitments, I often struggled to finish reading on time. But I prayed earnestly that I should complete the reading within the given time. The Lord heard my prayer and gave me the grace to finish.

Finally, what would you like to share in a few sentences?

Book Introduction

 This letter brings out wonderful thoughts about unity and joy. It strongly emphasizes that these can be obtained through Christ Jesus

Context and Purpose

• Being one of Paul's prison epistles, the letter to the Philippians was written in Rome. During his second missionary journey (Acts 16:12), Apostle Paul traveled to Philippi, where Lydia, the Philippian jailer, and his household were brought into Christ. A few years later the church there was well established. This letter is a gentle one written particularly to this Christian community that was close to Paul's heart (2 Corinthians 8:1-6). During his second missionary journey Paul converted many in Philippi. Though he was imprisoned, he miraculously escaped from prison. During his third missionary journey also, he came there (Acts 20:1,6). After Epaphroditus, who had fallen seriously ill, was healed, Paul wrote this letter from prison and sent it with him (Philippians 2:25-30). He writes this letter both to thank the Philippians for helping him and to encourage them to stand firm in Christian faith with joy and courage.

Key Verses

Philippians 1:21, Philippians 3:7, Philippians 4:4, Philippians 4:6-7, Philippians 4:13

Summary of the Book

 This was written while Paul was in prison in Rome, about thirty years after Christ's ascension, and about ten years after Paul first preached in Philippi. Its main themes are Christ in our mind, Christ as our goal, Christ as our strength, and joy through suffering. Though Paul was a prisoner of Nero, the letter was written with great triumph. The words "joy" and "rejoice" are repeatedly mentioned (Philippians 1:4, 18, 25, 26; 2:2, 28; Philippians 3:1; 4:1, 4, 10). The true Christian experience, regardless of circumstances, is the expression of the life, nature, and mind of Christ who dwells in us (Philippians 1:6, 11; 2:5, 13). With the famous and profound declaration about the humiliation and exaltation of our Lord Jesus Christ, Philippians 2:5-11 reaches its climax. In this letter Paul gives a self-explanation (1:12-26; 4:10-19); he describes his imprisonment; he exhorts the Philippians to be steadfast in sufferings (1:27, 30; 4:4); he urges them to be humble and united; he presents Jesus, who humbled Himself and was exalted by the Father, as their example (2:1-11; 4:2-3). Paul wishes the Philippian church to receive Timothy and Epaphroditus (2:19-30). He warns the Philippians against Judaizing (3:1-21). He thanks the Philippians for their support (4:10-20).

Jesus Christ in the Book

 As in many of his letters, Paul warned the new believers in the Philippian church, urging them to be cautious regarding the legalistic tendencies that kept creeping into the early churches. The Jews constantly tried to revert to the teaching of salvation by works. But Paul once again emphasized that Christian salvation comes only by faith and branded the Judaizers as "dogs" and "evil workers." In particular, legalists.

insisted that new believers in Christ should continue to be circumcised according to the old covenant (Genesis 17:10-12; Leviticus 12:3). In this way they attempted to please God by their own effort and exalted themselves over Gentile Christians who did not participate in the rite. Paul explained that those washed in the blood of the Lamb would no longer perform rituals that symbolized the necessity of a pure heart. Application

• Paul exhorts us to be steadfast during times of persecution, "to stand firm in one spirit, striving together with one mind for the faith of the gospel" (Philippians 1:27). Another application of Philippians is the necessity for Christians to be united in humility. Since we are united with Christ, we should strive to be united with one another as well. Paul reminds us, "being of the same mind, having the same love, being united in spirit and intent," and setting aside pride and selfishness, "but in humility regarding others as more important than yourselves" and being concerned for the good of others (Philippians 2:2-4). If we all take heed to Paul's advice, conflicts in today's churches will be greatly reduced. Paul rejoices that Christ is preached (Philippians 1:8); he rejoices in his own suffering (2:18). He exhorts others to rejoice in the Lord (3:1). He also refers to the Philippian brothers as his "joy and crown" (4:1). "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice" (4:4-7). As believers, "in everything by prayer and supplication let your requests be made known to God" (4:6).

GODependence Newsletter Survey: Results and Highlights

We are thrilled to share the encouraging results of our recent GODependence Newsletter survey. The overwhelming response from 34 persons demonstrates the deep engagement and commitment of our readership, confirming that the content is powerfully impacting spiritual lives and promoting dedicated Bible reading habits. Thank you for taking the time to provide valuable input.

Key Findings on Engagement and Impact

The survey revealed high levels of readership, deep engagement, and overall satisfaction:

- Consistent Readership: A significant majority of readers, 61.8%, report reading the GODependence newsletter every month.
