

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On behalf of the GODependence team, I extend my loving New Year greetings to all of you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I thank God for granting us this opportunity to see this New Year and to reconnect with you once again through this newsletter.

I wish that this New Year will be a fruitful year for each one of us. As we carefully observe the situations unfolding across the nations, we come to realise that our lives, health, and strength today are sustained solely by God's sovereign grace. We can understand this truth through the parable spoken by Jesus in Luke 13:6-9.

Time (vv. 6-7): In this parable, the owner of the vineyard comes seeking fruit from the fig tree he had planted for three years, but finds none. Therefore, he decides to cut it down. But the keeper of the vineyard pleads, "Sir, let it alone this year also...". God, who created us in this world for a purpose, has every right and justification to decide that our lives are no longer necessary if, upon review, He finds no fulfillment of that purpose in us. Yet, just as the keeper of the vineyard interceded, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit intercede on our behalf, and by the grace of the Triune God, this year too has been graciously granted to us.

As we enter this New Year, we must understand this truth. This year must not become just another ordinary year for us. We have no right to presume that we will live through it because of our age or physical strength, our lives continue purely by God's grace. The God who has graciously extended our time has also extended His expectation and the opportunity to fulfil it—and He is fully able to bring it to accomplish it.

Care (v. 8): The keeper of the vineyard does not merely ask for an extension of one year for the fig tree. He says, "I dig around it and fertilise it." Digging and fertilising are uncomfortable for both the gardener and the tree, yet they are essential for growth and fruitfulness. Likewise, to remove the hidden sins, wrong priorities, and spiritual negligence within us, God may sometimes need to dig around us, and at other times, apply fertiliser. We must fully submit ourselves to this divine process.

Through His Word, our prayer life, and fellowship with believers, God nourishes us. This New Year, we must allow God to do a deep work in our hearts. If that does not happen, this year too will simply pass by as another routine year, leaving our future uncertain. Therefore, let us dedicate ourselves to God's hands this year and allow true growth and transformation to take place in our lives.

Fruit (v. 9): God has graciously given us an additional year because He expects fruit from us. The extension of our lives is not merely due to His patience or grace alone, but because He hopes that at least this year we will bear fruit in our spiritual lives. He expects from us the fruit of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control—and a life obedient to Him, reflecting His character, serving others through His love, and bearing witness by leading others to Him.

As the days, weeks, and months of this year pass by, it is essential that we regularly examine ourselves to see what fruit is being produced in us. God is not pleased merely with our activities, He desires fruit in our spiritual lives. A fruitful life glorifies God and becomes a blessing to others.

May this New Year become a year in which we allow God to dig and fertilize us through His Word and prayer life, experience transformation, and bear fruit for Him.

Let us thank God for His abundant grace in blessing all the events related to International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR 2025) held on last month. GODEpendence seminars on the history of the Bible were conducted in 8 languages, Bible Readathon programs were held in 6 languages, and International Day of Bible Reading Zoom gatherings took place in 7 languages.

On Sunday, December 21, 2025, God graciously enabled the GODEpendence team to review our ministry activities for the year 2025 and prayerfully plan for the year 2026. As many people are joining the 2026 New Year Bible

Reading Challenges, we also planned ways to address the challenges we face as a Team and to serve the Lord even more effectively in 2026.

The Slogans of Protestant Reformation



Slogan 2 : "Faith alone!" (Sola Fide)

The Scripture text that ignited the mind of Martin Luther was Romans 1:16,17, "The Gospel of Christ is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes ... For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith, as it is written, THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH." This is not an isolated or obscure text from the Bible. This appears in 4 places: Habakkuk 2:4, Galatians 3:11, Romans 1:17, Hebrews 10:38. The message is that we are NOT saved by any works of religion but only by faith on Christ. Apostle Paul emphasizes it in Ephesians 2:8,9, "By grace you have been saved through faith, and that NOT of yourselves, it is the gift of God, NOT of works, lest anyone should boast." Not of "yourselves" – our personality. Not of "works" – our performance.

Here lies the fundamental difference between the Old Testament and the New. The OT says, "It will be righteousness for us, if we are careful to OBSERVE all these commandments before the Lord our God, as He has commanded us" (Deuteronomy 6:25). On the other hand the NT declares, "But now the righteousness of God APART FROM THE LAW is revealed, even the righteousness of God which is through faith in Jesus Christ to all and on all who believe" (Romans 3:21,22).

Apostle Paul reiterates this truth in his Epistle to Galatians who were disturbed by the advocates of circumcision: "A man is NOT justified by the WORKS of the law BUT by faith in Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus,

that we might be justified by faith in Christ and NOT by the WORKS of the Law, because by the works of the Law no flesh shall be justified" (Galatians 2:16). You will be thrilled to observe the repeated mention of the word "faith" in this Epistle (Galatians 2:20, 3:2,5,6,7,8,9,11,12,14, 22,23,23,25, etc.).

Abraham was justified by faith 430 years BEFORE the Law was given (Galatians 3:17). The Law was a later addition and that too for a stipulated period only: "The Law was added till the Seed (Christ) should come" (v19). Also, Abraham was justified "NOT while circumcised, but while uncircumcised" (Rom 4:9,10). Yes, Abraham was justified by faith, and not by Circumcision or the Law. What does this teach us today? Water baptism, infant or adult, sprinkling or immersion, does not save us. You become a child of God the moment you personally believe on the Lord Jesus Christ as your Saviour (John 1:12, Romans 10:9-11). Then follows baptism as the first step of obedience (Acts 8:36-38, 10:47,48, 16:30-33).

The one and only condition for salvation is faith on Christ. Here are two classic examples: (1) Evangelist Philip preached Jesus to the Ethiopian official in the Gaza desert. On seeing some water, the official asked Philip, "See, here is water, what hinders me from being baptized?" (Acts 8:35,36). Note carefully the instant answer: "If you believe with all your heart, you may" (v37). (2) The Philippian Jailor asked Paul and Silas, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" The instant answer was, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your family" (Acts 16:30,31). He believed on Christ with his family and they were all baptized "the same hour of the night" (v33). In both these instances the inquirer was not prescribed seven steps to salvation! By climbing seven steps you will not be saved, you will only become tired!

Beware of “discipleship” salvation. It teaches that you must reach a certain level of spirituality in order to be baptized. The word “disciple” simply means “student.” Whether in kindergarten or postgraduate class, you are a student. It is AFTER enrolling as a student, you grow in knowledge. Similarly the moment you wholeheartedly believe on Jesus you are enrolled as a disciple (Matthew 28:19). Then follows growth through regular teaching (v20). It is not by self-efforts like “ascending” or “descending” that we get saved, but only by mouth confession and heart belief (Romans 10:4- 10). (Read my 128-page book, Faith Life, available in English and Tamil.) A Church planting missionary organisation in India lost a tribal group when its missionaries insisted that the tribeswomen must break their bangles before baptism. Oh, how much we have failed to understand the New Testament truths! (Acts 15:28,29).



A Playwright - Turned - Missionary

Biography of Adoniram Judson

(1788-1850)

It was a little congregation of children in a parsonage singing, "Go preach My Gospel, saith the Lord." Was it a Sunday School Class or some children's meeting? Neither! For very soon a four year old boy mounted a chair and preached to the group with great solemnity. These children were playing church and Adoniram Judson, the son of the minister, was the preacher.

Early Life

Adoniram Judson was born on August 9, 1788. At an early age he seemed to possess unusual ability.

A Brilliant Student

Even at the age of three he had learned to read, and his father was surprised one day to hear him read a whole chapter from the Bible. He was very fond of solving mathematical problems. At the age of 10 he was a brilliant mathematician and was studying Latin and Greek, besides some deep theology books. He was noted for his ability in Greek.

At 16 he entered Brown University and graduated at 19 as the first scholar in his class. During his college days he had a close friend who was also able and talented, but was an unbeliever.

That young man did not believe in miracles or in the Bible. Influenced by him, Adoniram also became an unbeliever saying that God could not be known personally. This grieved his parents very much. Moreover, after graduation his ambition was to become a famous, lawyer or a playwright. He had joined a theatrical party in New York.

Finding God

However, young Adoniram was restless and there seemed to be no definite purpose in life. Life in the theatrical party could not satisfy him. He went through the misery of a man without Christ. One night at a country inn where he was staying, a man was at the point of death lying in the next room. Throughout the night Adoniram was awake listening to the groans of the dying man.

The more we know the Scripture the more we shall find that it deals with our modern and contemporary problems. - Martin Lloyd Jones

The next morning he was shocked to find out that the man was his infidel friend from Brown University. He realized that his friend was not prepared to die and this realization made him desperate. Six weeks later the restless Adoniram found rest and peace of heart by accepting Christ as his personal Saviour.

God's Call

After the transformation that had come over his life, his one ambition was to please God. Everywhere in his room there were mottoes asking, "Is it pleasing to God?" His other ambitions were gone and he wanted to do that which would please God in his future life. A book which he had read turned his thoughts in the direction of missionary work. Christ's command "Go ye into all the world" which he had sung as a hymn in his childhood began to grip him, and his ambition now was to be a foreign missionary. But how could he go? There was no missionary society in America which could send him. Adoniram prayed. There were four other young men who shared his missionary convictions and all the five of them began to pray.

God answered their prayer. In 1810 the American Board of Missions was formed and Judson was sent to London to see if the London Missionary Society would send and support American missionaries. France was at war with Britain at that time. So Judson's ship was captured and he was thrown into a filthy cell as a prisoner. He was discouraged that he did not know French to tell his captors about Christ. One day an unknown American came into the prison and hiding Judson under a military cloak walked out with him. Arriving in England, he found out that the London Board did not favor his proposals. However, he was happy to find that the American Board decided to support him.

In a Strange land

In 1812 Adoniram Judson married Ann Hasseltine and almost immediately sailed for India for missionary work. However, God's plans for him pointed to another country. The East India Company which was in power in India in those days did not favor missionary work in India. So when the Judsons arrived after four months of sea voyage, they were immediately ordered back to America. Surely that must have been discouraging. Hadn't God called them out as missionaries? So they decided to stay. However, they were compelled to sail from one place to another until at last they landed in Rangoon, Burma. Thus God's choice for them turned out to be Burma.

As I read each letter in that Book of God, I worship the eternal mind which inspired it.

Burma at that time

Burma in those days was ruled by a king who had absolute power. The people were slaves to him. He was very hostile to missionaries. The religion of Burma was Buddhism and it was well organized. There were no Christians in Burma. No one had ever heard much about Christ. Without Christ in their hearts the people walked about with sad faces and burdened hearts. Judson and his wife often looked at the people and felt sad. They worked hard studying the language so that they might tell the people about Christ. After a year and a half, Ann had to go to Madras (India) for medical help and Adoniram continued his language study alone. Very soon a baby boy was born to them. But after eight months, much to their sorrow, they lost this child.

Toiling


Adoniram believed that if the Burmese had the Word of God in their language, many of them might find salvation. So he spent 14 hours a day studying the language and translating the Bible. With a hand press he printed tracts and portions of the Bible. A new missionary, Mr. Hough, arrived with his wife and he was a printer. Very soon the Gospel of Mathew was being printed. After two years of toiling, one day an enquirer came to Judson and asked for more Christian literature. Only five pages of Mathew's Gospel were ready and Judson handed him those.

Judson erected a public meeting place and preached to the people in Burmese. At night he spent long hours in praying for the people. There were many, including some priests, who showed interest. Six years after Judson arrived in Burma, Moung Nau the first convert came forward and asked for baptism. Though this might have meant persecution and death, he bravely made the decision. Gradually others accepted Christ and there were 18 loyal Christians in Rangoon. At that time Ann was stricken with fever and was sent to America. Judson carried on his teaching and translating and finally finished the New Testament. A new emperor came to power and Judson made a trip to his palace to obtain permission to carry on the work.

International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) – 2025



Praise God for the International Day of Bible Reading (IDBR) 2025 observed on 16 December 2025. The theme for this year was **“Read the Bible; Renew Your Life.”** This theme guided all the IDBR activities, inspiring believers to engage deeply with the Scriptures, grow in faith and experience spiritual renewal.

During the IDBR 2025 activities, participants from across India and beyond joined the Bible Readathon in 6 languages, Talk shows on the History of the Bible in 8 languages, the Online Mega Bible Quiz in English, Tamil, and Hindi and the Zoom gatherings in 7 languages. These activities encouraged reflection, discussion, and exploration of the Scriptures.

Through these activities, participants not only read the Bible but also experienced transformation in their lives, embodying the theme: “Read the Bible – let truth ignite your soul, Renew Your Life – be transformed and made whole.”

By the grace of the Lord, we were able to conduct the **Bible Readathon** in six languages as part of the International Day of Bible Reading observances. The purpose of this event was to promote Bible reading, strengthen faith, unite believers, support evangelism, and inspire spiritual renewal. The Readathon was conducted using Streamyard software and was live-streamed on the GODependence YouTube and Facebook channels.


THE SHUNAMMITE WOMAN



History of the English Bible

Indian Version

God wants to live in relationship with his loved ones. In order to establish and maintain relationship we need to know each other. God knows everything about us. But we can know him only if he reveals himself to us. God has revealed himself through general revelations, that is his creation and his work in human history. In addition to these two general revelations, he has also given us two special revelations in the written Word of God, the Bible, and through the living word of God, Jesus Christ.

God chose his servants and inspired them to write down his messages to the people to whom he wanted to reveal himself. These writings were, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, collected and canonized as Scripture. Thus we have 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament that reveal to us about God's nature, purposes and his expectations from us. These books were written in the languages of the first recipients, Old Testament in Hebrew and the New Testament in Greek. Since we don't speak these languages, we need the Scripture to be translated into our own languages. In this article we will briefly look into the history of the English translation of the Bible.

John Wycliffe and his followers translated the Bible in English from the Latin Vulgate around the year 1380. **William Tyndale** was the first one to translate English Bible from Greek and Hebrew. He completed the NT in 1526 and was martyred before he could complete the OT. **Miles Coverdale** completed it in 1535.

.....

After that Great Bible (1539) and Geneva Bible (1560) came into existence **King James I**, commissioned to bring out an authorised version of the Bible and in 1611 it was published as KJV. When its language became archaic, it was revised as English Revised version in 1885.

Publication dates of some popular Bible translations:

1901 - The American Standard Version
1952 - Revised Standard Version
1971- New American Standard Bible
1973 - New International Version
1982 - New King James Version
1990 - New Revised Standard Version
2002 - English Standard Version

Introduction to the Book

• The two letters written to Timothy and the letter written to Titus are known as the Pastoral Epistles. They are called so because they were written to pastors (bishops) Timothy and Titus and deal with matters related to pastoral ministry.

mentor and leader to Timothy, being like a father to him, while Timothy was like a son to Paul (1 Tim. 1:2). Paul begins the letter by urging Timothy to be on guard against false teachers and false doctrines. However, much of the letter focuses on pastoral conduct. Paul instructs Timothy about worship (chapter 2) and the development of mature church leaders (chapter 3). Much of the letter addresses pastoral behavior, warnings about false teachers, and the church's responsibility toward widows, elders, and slaves. Throughout the letter, Paul encourages Timothy to stand firm, persevere, and remain faithful to his calling.

Context and Purpose

• Timothy, a co-worker of Paul, was from Lystra. His father was a Greek (a Gentile), and his mother was a Jewish Christian (Acts 16:1). He became a Christian through Paul and served alongside him during the second and third missionary journeys (Acts 16:3; 19:22). Paul often sent Timothy on important missions (Acts 19:2; 1 Cor.

4:17; 1 Thess. 3:2). According to 1 Timothy 1:3, Timothy served as the overseer (bishop) of the church in Ephesus. After appointing Timothy to oversee the church in Ephesus (1:3), Paul went to Macedonia. Realizing

that he might not return to Ephesus, Paul wrote this letter to remind Timothy of his responsibilities as a bishop. Paul wrote to encourage him in his responsibility of supervising the church in Ephesus and the other churches in the province of Asia (1 Tim. 1:3). This letter lays the foundation for appointing elders (1 Tim. 3:1-7) and provides guidance for appointing people to offices in the church (1 Tim. 3:8-13). In essence, 1 Timothy serves as a leadership manual for church organization and administration.

Key Verses

Summary of the Book

• Paul instructs Timothy to oppose false teachings (1:3-7; 4:1-8; 6:3-5, 20-21), because Gnostic ideas were beginning to spread at that time. This teaching claimed that the world was evil, that salvation required secret knowledge, that certain foods must be avoided, and that marriage should be forbidden. Paul urges Timothy to carefully oversee worship and administration in the Ephesian church (2:1-15) and advises him to appoint qualified leaders (3:1-13; 5:17-25). This is the first letter Paul wrote to Timothy, a young pastor who assisted him in ministry. Timothy was of mixed heritage—his mother was Jewish and his father was Greek. Paul acted as a

Jesus Christ in the Book

Jesus Christ is presented by Paul as the mediator between God and humanity (1 Tim. 2:5).

Practical Application

Paul instructs Timothy on matters of church doctrine, leadership, and administration. The same principles can be applied to the governance of local churches today. Likewise, the role and ministry of a pastor, as well as the qualifications for elders and overseers, remain as important and relevant today as they were in Timothy's time. This letter provides guidance on leading, managing, and shepherding the local church. The instructions in this epistle apply to any current or future church leader and are just as applicable today as they were in Paul's day. Every follower of Christ must contend for the faith, avoid false teachings, and stand firm with perseverance.




