## THE LIGHT OF ALL MANKIND

In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. (John 1:4-5)

Light is one of the most powerful images in the Bible. It represents truth, guidance, purity, and the presence of God. Darkness, on the other hand, symbolizes ignorance, sin, confusion, and separation from God. This darkness is not merely intellectual ignorance, it is a condition of the human heart. Even today, we see that darkness is reflected in the uncertainty, chaos, and confusion that characterize much of human life.

Into such a world, Christ comes as light. His life reveals God's character, His teachings illuminate truth, and His sacrifice opens the way to redemption. In Him is the life that humanity desperately needs. This life is not merely biological existence but the fullness of life that comes from a restored relationship with God.

A story from the mission field powerfully captures this reality. A village woman once said to a missionary, “You have brought us the light, but we do not seem to want it. You have brought us the light, yet we still choose to walk in darkness.” Her words reflected a painful but honest observation about the human condition. The problem is not the absence of light, rather, it is humanity’s reluctance to receive it. Even when the truth of the Gospel is presented clearly, people sometimes cling to familiar patterns of darkness.

This tension between light and darkness is not only a global or societal issue, it is deeply personal. Each person must decide whether to remain in darkness or step into the light. To walk in the light means to embrace the truth revealed in Christ, to allow His life to transform our hearts, and to reflect His light in the world around us.

The message of John 1:4-5, therefore, carries both hope and challenge. The hope is that the light continues to shine. Darkness, no matter how deep, cannot extinguish it. The challenge is whether we will respond to that light. Will we continue in darkness, or will we allow the light of Christ to illuminate our lives?

But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. – 1 John 1:7

## Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On behalf of the GODependence team, I extend my loving greetings to all of you. I thank God for giving us this opportunity to reconnect with you once again through this newsletter.

The war that began in the Middle East before the end of the second month of this year, has already started to affect the entire world. While the causes of wars in the world are often explained in terms of politics, land, security, or historical conflicts, the Bible reveals that the real cause begins in the inner condition of the human heart. James 4:1 says: “What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don’t they come from your desires that battle within you?”

### 1. The Hidden Cause of Conflicts – Desires that Battle Within

As the Apostle James points out, the root cause of conflicts in a person’s inner life is the desires that battle within the heart. When greed, pride, the desire for revenge, and the urge for domination arise within a person, they lead to conflicts among people. To overcome these inner struggles, individuals need the guidance of God’s Word. When we read and meditate on the Bible daily, God reshapes our thoughts and desires according to His will and leads us on the path of inner peace.

### 2. The Expansion of Desires – From the Individual Heart to Global Conflicts

If the desires that arise in a person’s heart are not controlled, they spread into families, communities, and eventually into conflicts between nations. When leaders and people are not guided by God’s justice and compassion, even small disagreements can grow into major wars. However, God’s Word transforms human attitudes. When individuals, families, and communities build their lives on the values of the Bible, peace begins to grow. Therefore, Bible reading is not merely a personal spiritual discipline, it has the power to transform society.

### 3. True Peace – Begins in Hearts Transformed by God’s Word

Lasting peace in the world cannot come through political solutions alone, it begins in transformed human hearts. God’s Word changes human desires and thoughts, turning hostility into love, pride into humility, and violence into peace. When we read the Bible daily, God works in our hearts and shapes us into instruments of peace. Although we may not be able to stop global wars directly, lives transformed by God’s Word can reveal peace to the world.

In this way, the wars taking place in the world remind us of the deep spiritual need of humanity. As long as God does not reign in human hearts, external peace cannot remain lasting. Therefore, let us surrender the “inner war” taking place in our personal lives to God and allow Him to transform our hearts through daily Bible reading. When God’s Word changes us, we too can become witnesses who reveal His peace in this world.

Let us pray for the war come to an end soon, and for the peace and harmony to prevail. Let us also pray for the safety of our loved ones in those regions and all the people who are suffering amid the hardships of war.

In the Ramadan Bible Reading Challenge will began on February 18 to read the entire Bible within 30 days, 271 persons have joined. In the Lenten Bible Reading Challenge, to read the entire Bible within 40 days, 1,406 persons have joined and reading the Bible currently.

# The Slogans of Protestant Reformation



## Slogan 3 : “Grace alone!” (Sola Gratia)

Under the previous slogan, we studied “works vs. faith.” Now we look at “law vs. grace.” The Bible clearly contrasts these two: Law and Grace. Let’s begin with John 1:17, “The Law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.” This is implied in the call of Jesus to Jews who were under the bondage of the Law: Matthew 11:28-30, “Come to Me, all you who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke on you and learn from Me, because I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Because My yoke is easy and My burden is light.” Obviously Jesus here was not referring to the weight of sin, but the “yoke” of the Law. He contrasts His yoke with the burden of the Law. The words “yoke” and “burden” are used only in this sense in the New Testament (Luke 11:46, Acts 15:10, Galatians 5:1).

On our side, justification is all by faith, and on God’s side it’s only through His grace. Romans 3:23,24, “All have sinned and fall short of glory of God, being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.” Salvation is God’s “gift” through grace (Eph 2:8,9). It’s not an award or a reward or a prize, but a gift. A gift cannot be earned or merited. C.H. Spurgeon, known as the Prince of Preachers, said, “Salvation is all of the grace of God, damnation is all of the will of man!” Only the will of man which refuses to believe will lead him to eternal hell.

I am busily engaged in the study of the Bible. I believe it is God's word because it finds me where I am. - Abraham Lincoln

Forgiveness of sins is according to the “riches of God’s grace” (Ephesians 1:7). Sins may be “innumerable” but the “riches” of God’s grace will overwhelm them! This is what Martin Luther emphasized. He stood against the Pope’s promise of forgiveness through the purchase of tickets to raise money for Church construction. Apostle Paul celebrated God’s grace when he said, “I am the chief of all sinners, but the grace of God towards me was abundant!” (1 Timothy 1:14,15). Paul’s timeless confession lifts our spirits: “I am what I am by the grace of God” (1 Corinthians 15:10a). Therefore dear believer friend, never ever despise the unsaved. Pointing at a drunkard dragged by policemen along the streets, John Wesley told his associate evangelists, “There goes John Wesley but for the grace of God!” For us who are under the Covenant of Grace there’s no “generational sin” (Ezekiel 18:1-4, Mark 10:13,14).

Not only our life but also our ministry must be characterised by the grace of God. Comparing his ministry to a race, Apostle Paul calls his message as the “Gospel of the grace of God” (Acts 20:24). He claimed, “I laboured more abundantly than all the apostles.” But he also added, “Yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me” (1 Corinthians 15:10b). No place for boasting! He calls God’s enablements for ministry as “gifts of grace” (Romans 12:6). The task before Zerubbabel was mountainous. No doubt he was an expert builder. The plumbline in his hands pleased the eyes of God. But the completion of the work was to be purely through the grace of God: “Zerubbabel shall bring forth the capstone with shouts of ‘Grace, Grace to it’ ” (Zechariah 4:7).





**When Life threatens you with unimaginable episodes, how do you manoeuvre?**

Though we look & dress confidently, we easily succumb to life's jeopardy!

The first step for your breakthrough is to **Evaluate** your mind! Do you magnify your problems or your Promises?

**Matt 14:31**

Before we first knew God, first experienced Him, the scriptures of the Bible were just words in a book, a story. That changed when we first came to know God.

# The Apostle of India

## Biography of Sundar Singh

(1889-1929)

The cold pierced his thin clothing, the thorns and stones cut his bare feet. Yet he walked on over the snow-covered mountain passes. His bleeding feet left behind him a trail of blood on the white snow. He sat down to bandage them. Another man who had been following him came near and started talking. "How do you feel?" he asked. "I am happy in Christ, my wonderful Saviour," answered Sundar Singh.

"Why do you travel with bare and bleeding feet over these mountains?". "In order to point people to Him, Whose feet bled on Calvary".

Sundar Singh believed that he was divinely called by the crucified Saviour to suffer for him and to take His gospel to countries like Tibet where no one had heard about Christ.

### As a Boy

Sundar Singh, commonly known as Sadhu Sundar Singh, was born on September 3, 1889 at Rampur in Punjab. His parents were Sikhs by religion and Sundar's mother was very devout and religious. She insisted that as soon as he awoke, Sundar should first spend time in praying to God for spiritual food and blessing, and then only have his breakfast. She loved him very much and wanted him to love religion and become a holy Sadhu. At a very early age, Sundar began to read the Hindu sacred book, the Bhagavadgita, and by the time he was seven had committed it to memory. The death of his dearest earthly friend turned him to the study of various sacred books. Often when others slept he would be pouring over the Granth of the Sikhs, the Vedas of the Hindus or the Koran of the Muslims. The intense thirst for spiritual satisfaction which characterizes thousands of our countrymen took hold of him.

### Meeting with the Living Christ

Sundar's first contact with Christianity was in a mission school in his village where he went to study. His heart revolted within him when he was asked to study the Bible in the school.

I don't read the Bible out of obligation. I read the Bible because Jesus is my best friend, and I want to know everything about Him. - Unknown

He openly tore up the pages of the New Testament and became the leader of the students who opposed Christianity. He left the Mission School and joined a Government School and continued to ridicule the Christian faith. Often he would incite ruffians to throw stones and mud at missionaries who preached in public. He even burned a copy of the New Testament openly. But the more vehemently he opposed Christ, the more miserable he became in his heart, and finally he began to read the Bible.

One day he arose at three 'O'clock in the morning with the determination to find peace or to end his life by throwing himself before the train that passed near his house. After his bath, he began to pray. "O God, if there be a God, reveal Thyself to me. Show me the way of salvation and grant Shanthi". Suddenly he saw a light in the room and in the light he saw the Living Christ whom he had hated. He showed His nail-pierced hands to Sundar and said, "Why do you persecute Me? I am your Saviour". Sundar's heart was immediately filled with joy and he knew that his spiritual hunger had been satisfied. His whole life was changed and no one could ever make him doubt that glorious experience.

### **Called to Suffer**



Immediately after that experience, Sundar went to his father and told him that he was a Christian. At first his father did not believe it. But later the entire family was alarmed at Sundar's decision to become a Christian. His father pleaded with him not to renounce his mother's religion and bring shame upon them all. A wealthy uncle took him to his large house, and showing him heaps of money and many precious gems and jewels, told him that he could have all of them if he renounced his new faith. But the love for Christ was too strong in his heart to be denied. He was driven from home. Without food and shelter' he spent the cold night under a tree. He was then allowed to return home. But his food was served outside the house and he had to sleep with the low caste servants. Sundar endured all this joyfully for the sake of his Master and this was only the beginning of the Cross which he was continuously to bear for His sake. Finally he was poisoned and driven from home. He became seriously ill and was at the point of death. But God saved him from death to fulfill His great purpose.

## DID YOU KNOW?

### Did you know that the Bible predicted a global visual communication network?

Yes, there is a clear indication in the Book of Revelation, written around 1927 years ago. It tells about an incident yet to happen. ## THE WIDOW WHO PUT IN TWO COINS



(Mark 12:41-44)

The story of this unnamed poor widow has been an eye-opener for all Christians for two thousand years.

This happened when Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury, and many rich people were putting in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, “Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.”

Sacrificial giving is an act of trusting God. Those who do it nonverbally

proclaim that God is able to meet their needs. While the Bible teaches us to care for our family members, it also commends sacrificial giving. (1 Timothy 5:8, 2 Corinthians 8:2-5).

# Bible Book Overview - Titus

## Titus

**Time of Writing:** A.D. 62 – A.D. 64

**Time of Events:** A.D. 62

**Author of the Book:** Paul

**Type of Book:** Letter

### Introduction to the Book

• Among the Pastoral Epistles, the letter written to Titus comes third. Although it appears third in biblical order, it seems likely that this was actually written first. Those who compiled these books did not arrange them by the date of writing, but by their length. Titus was a Gentile Christian. He went with Paul from Antioch to Jerusalem (Gal. 2:1; Acts 15:2). He also accompanied Paul during his third missionary journey (2 Cor. 1:13; 7:6; 8:23). This epistle is said to have been written when Titus was serving as pastor on the island of Crete. He was given the responsibility of appointing elders and overseers there.

### Context and Purpose

• This letter written to Titus by Paul is one of the Pastoral Epistles, like the two letters written to Timothy. Paul wrote this epistle to encourage his fellow worker Titus in the faith, whom he left in Crete to lead the church that Paul had established during one of his missionary journeys (Titus 1:5). The letter instructs Titus on the qualifications required for church leaders. Paul also warns Titus regarding the reputation of the Cretan people (Titus 1:12). Along with instructing Titus on what to look for in church leaders, Paul encourages Titus to come to Nicopolis (Titus 3:12). In other words, as Paul himself grew in the grace of the Lord, he disciplined Titus and others to follow him (Titus 3:13).

### Key Verses

Titus 1:5; Titus 1:16; Titus 2:15; Titus 3:3-6

### Summary of the Book

• It must have been wonderful for Titus to receive a letter from his mentor, the Apostle Paul. After planting many churches throughout the Eastern world, Paul was a highly respected man. Titus would have read this famous apostolic introduction: *"To Titus, my true son in our common faith: Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior."* (Titus 1:4). On the island of Crete where Titus was left to lead the church, both native islanders and Jews who did not know the truth about Jesus Christ were living there (Titus 1:12-14). Feeling responsible to guide Titus in developing leaders for the church in Crete, Paul encouraged and instructed him. Just as Paul guided Titus in choosing leaders, he also advised how those leaders should guide others so that they would grow in faith in Christ. His instructions included men and women of all ages (Titus 2:1-8). To help Titus continue steadfastly in his faith in Christ, Paul suggested that he come to Nicopolis and bring two other members of the church with him (Titus 3:12-13). In the challenging situation of church growth in Crete, Paul urged Titus to choose the right co-workers (Titus 1:5-16). He explains

how to teach the elderly, the young, and slaves in the Cretan church, and finally speaks about Christian virtue—living with peace and love, avoiding hatred, arguments, and divisions. Paul says that the redeeming sacrifice of Christ is the model by which the Cretan people must transform their lives.

### Jesus Christ in the Book

• When we look to Scripture for instruction on how to live a life pleasing to our Lord, the book of Titus is worthy of our attention. Here we learn what to avoid and what to pursue. Paul says that by avoiding things that corrupt our mind and conscience, we strive to remain pure. Then Paul makes a statement that should never be forgotten: *"They claim to know God, but by their actions they deny him. They are detestable, disobedient, and unfit for doing anything good."* (Titus 1:16). As Christians, we must examine ourselves to ensure that our lives agree with our faith in Christ (2 Cor. 13:5). With this warning, Paul also tells us how to avoid denying God: *"He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior."*

### Practical Application

• When we look to the Bible for instruction on how to live a life pleasing to our Lord, the book of Titus deserves our attention. Here we can learn what to avoid and what to pursue. Paul says that we strive to be pure by avoiding things that corrupt our minds and consciences. Then Paul makes a statement that should never be forgotten: *"They claim to know God, but by their actions they deny him. They are detestable, disobedient and unfit for doing anything good"* (Titus 1:16). As Christians, we must examine ourselves to make sure that our lives are consistent with our faith in Christ (2 Corinthians 13:5). Along with this warning, Paul also tells us how to avoid denying God: *"He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior"* (Titus 3:5b-6). By allowing the Holy Spirit to renew our minds daily, we can become Christians who honor God in the way we live.

# Bible Book Overview - Philemon

## PHILEMON

**Time of Writing:** A.D. 60 – A.D. 62  
**Time of Events:** A.D. 60

**Author of the Book:** Paul  
**Type of Book:** Letter

### Introduction to the Book

- Among the letters of the New Testament, the Epistle to Philemon stands as a letter of recommendation and appeal. Paul wrote this short letter in a graceful and refined style. It emphasizes the noble Christian principle that love and forgiveness should be abundant, and that even those who have done wrong should be received with love. The letter is written in an elegant and structured manner, following the style of recommendation letters commonly found in ancient Roman and Greek literature.

### Context and Purpose

- The letter to Philemon is the shortest among all of Paul's writings. At the time of writing, Paul was in prison. Philemon was a wealthy Christian and the master of a slave, and he also hosted a house church in his home. During Paul's ministry in Ephesus, it is possible that Philemon traveled there, heard Paul's preaching, and became a Christian. Onesimus, a slave belonging to Philemon, stole something from his master and ran away, eventually going to Rome, where Paul was imprisoned. According to Roman law, Onesimus still legally belonged to Philemon. Paul wrote this letter to ease Onesimus's return to his master. Through Paul's testimony and guidance, Onesimus became a Christian (Philemon 10). Paul therefore requested Philemon to receive Onesimus not merely as a slave, but as a brother in Christ. Philemon was an influential and wealthy Christian from Colossae, and Onesimus had been working as his slave. Under certain circumstances, Onesimus ran away from his master (verse 18). According to Roman law, such an act could even be punished with death. However, Onesimus came to Paul, who was a friend of Philemon. After staying with Paul for some time and becoming a Christian, Onesimus wished to return to his master. At that time, Paul wrote this appeal letter, asking Philemon to forgive and accept Onesimus. This letter was written by Paul around A.D. 61 from the prison in Rome.

### Key Verses

- Philemon 6, 16, 18

### Summary of the Book

- Paul reminded slave owners that they have responsibilities toward their slaves, and he presented slaves as moral individuals who must live in reverence to God. In the letter to Philemon, Paul does not directly condemn slavery, but he presents Onesimus as a Christian brother rather than merely a slave. When a master calls a slave his brother, the legal status of slavery loses its meaning. The early Christian church did not directly attack slavery, but it laid the foundation for a new relationship between master and slave. Paul attempted to unite both Philemon and Onesimus in Christian love.

He believed that true freedom from slavery would ultimately come through the transforming light of the Gospel.

### Jesus Christ in the Book

- Perhaps no other book in the New Testament illustrates the difference between Law and Grace as beautifully as Philemon. According to Roman law and the Law of Moses in the Old Testament, Philemon had the right to punish a runaway slave who was considered his property. However, the covenant of grace through Jesus Christ allowed both master and slave to stand on equal ground in the body of Christ, sharing fellowship in love.

### Practical Application


- Employers, political leaders, administrators, and parents can follow the spirit of Paul's teaching by treating Christian workers, colleagues, and family members as members of the body of Christ. Christians in modern society should not treat their helpers as mere tools to achieve their goals, but rather as brothers and sisters in Christ, treating them with compassion and respect. Furthermore, whether their workers are Christians or not, all Christian leaders are accountable to God for the way they treat those who work for them. Ultimately, they must give an account of their actions to God (Colossians 4:1).

# The History of the Bengali Bible

## Introduction

For Christians, the Bible is the living Word of God that guides believers in faith and daily life. Many people explain the word Bible as “**Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth.**” Though this is not the original meaning of the word, it beautifully expresses the purpose of Scripture—providing guidance for our journey on earth before entering eternity.

The Bible was written over a period of approximately **1600 years** by around **40 authors** from different backgrounds—prophets, kings, shepherds, fishermen, and scholars. It contains **66 books**, divided into two main sections: the **Old Testament** with **39 books** and the **New Testament** with **27 books**.

Between these two sections lies a period of about **400 years**, often called the Silent Years. The Old Testament concludes with the **Book of Malachi**, and the New Testament begins with the **Gospel of Matthew**, introducing the birth of Jesus Christ.

## Original Languages of the Bible

Although the Bible is now available in thousands of languages, it was originally written in **three ancient languages**:

- **Hebrew** – the primary language of the Old Testament
- **Aramaic** – used in some sections of the Old Testament
- **Greek** – the language of the New Testament

Most of the Old Testament was written in Hebrew, while certain portions of the **Book of Daniel** and the **Book of Jeremiah** contain Aramaic passages.

The New Testament was written in Greek, which was the common language of the Mediterranean world during the first century. Through these languages, the message of God’s salvation was preserved and passed down through generations.

## The Bible and World Translations

The Bible is the **most widely translated book in the world**. One of the earliest major translations was the Greek translation of the Hebrew Scriptures known as the **Septuagint**, produced around the third century BC.

Over time, the Bible was translated into many languages so that people could read God's Word in their own mother tongue. Among the most influential English translations is the King James Version, first published in 1611, which played a significant role in shaping Christian literature and devotion.

Today, translations such as the **New International Version** and others continue to help readers understand Scripture in clear and contemporary language. This global tradition of Bible translation eventually reached the Bengali-speaking world as well.

### Early Efforts to Translate the Bible into Bengali

The earliest attempts to translate the Bible into Bengali were made by **Portuguese Catholic missionaries** working in the Indian subcontinent. Their goal was to communicate the Christian message to local communities in their own language.

Around 1743, a Portuguese missionary named **Manuel da Assumpção** translated portions of the New Testament into Bengali. Although these early translations were limited in circulation, they laid the foundation for later efforts.

A significant turning point came after the **Battle of Plassey in 1757**, when British influence expanded in Bengal. This period opened new opportunities for Protestant missionaries to engage in translation and educational work.

### William Carey and the Bengali Bible

The most important figure in the history of the Bengali Bible is **William Carey**, often called the **Father of Modern Missions**.

Carey arrived in India in **1793** with a deep passion to make the Bible accessible to people in their own languages. Recognizing the importance of Bengali, he began studying the language and soon started translating the New Testament.

After years of dedicated work, the **Bengali New Testament** was published in 1801. Carey continued his translation work and completed the **Old Testament in 1809**, producing the first complete Bengali Bible.

This monumental task required **about sixteen years of labor**. Carey worked with local scholars and missionaries at the **Serampore Mission**, where printing presses enabled the Bible to be produced and distributed widely.

Carey spent nearly **four decades** in India and passed away in **1834**. During his lifetime, he translated or helped translate the Bible into several languages and initiated translation work in many others.

### Other Contributors to the Bengali Bible

While Carey played a central role, he was not alone in this mission. Several colleagues and scholars assisted him in translation and printing. Among them were **Joshua Marshman** and **William Ward**, who were part of the famous **Serampore Trio**. Their combined efforts helped establish a strong foundation for Bible translation and publication in South Asia.

Later, other scholars continued revising and improving the Bengali Bible. One such contributor was William Yates, who produced a revised Bengali translation in 1845. Through these ongoing efforts, the Bengali Bible became clearer, more accurate, and more accessible to readers.

### Modern Bengali Bible Versions

Over the years, several Bengali Bible versions have been produced to meet the needs of different readers. These include:

- Carey Version
- Serampore Version
- Calcutta Bible Society Version
- Common Language Version
- Easy-to-Read Version
- Contemporary Bengali Bible

Each of these translations attempts to present God's Word in language that is understandable to its readers.

However, language constantly evolves. Words that were easily understood two centuries ago may sound unfamiliar to modern readers. This has led to discussions about the need for revisions and new translations.

### Challenges in the Modern Era

Today, many young believers in Bengali-speaking communities prefer reading the Bible in English rather than Bengali. While English translations provide access to global scholarship and resources, this trend can sometimes weaken the connection between faith and the mother tongue.

Encouraging believers—especially younger generations—to read the Bible in Bengali remains an important challenge for churches and ministries.

Practical steps may include promoting Bible reading programs, organizing study groups, publishing Christian literature in Bengali, and developing digital Bible resources.

### Conclusion

Today, the Bengali Bible remains a precious spiritual treasure. As believers continue to read and live according to God's Word, they participate in a rich heritage that began centuries ago and continues to shape lives today.

As Scripture reminds us in **Book of Revelation 1:3**, "Blessed is the one who reads the words of this prophecy," and in **Gospel of Luke 11:28**, "Blessed rather are those who hear the Word of God and obey it." May the Word of God continue to illuminate hearts and guide believers in every generation.
